Glenholme School BICYCLE PROCEDURE

- Glenholme School and NZ Police recommends that children under 10 years of age **DO NOT** ride bicycles to or from school. Students younger than 10 should be accompanied by an adult.
- Parents/ caregivers who choose to allow their child/ren to bike to and from school are responsible. (Glenholme School is responsible for students whilst inside the school gates).
 - Children must correctly wear a "Standards" approved bicycle helmet at all times when in control of a bicycle.
 - All Land Transport New Zealand (LTNZ) road codes concerning cyclists are to be followed (www.ltsa.govt.nz).
 - Bicycles ridden to school must be in good, safe working order. It is the responsibility of the parent/caregivers to ensure that the bicycle is in good and safe working order and that all protective equipment as required by law is provided.
- Bicycle riders are expected to use the available bicycle entry points. These are via the following entry points; Ranolf Street and Miller Street.
 - Bicycle riders are to dismount before entering the school grounds and walk their bicycles whilst on site.
- Bicycles are to be stored in the bike rack provided. Bicycles must be locked with a chain and padlock supplied by the bicycle owner. Bicycles and helmets brought and stored on school grounds are at the owner's risk.




