- Students in Pukeroa (B6, C6 & C7) and Pukehangi (A6, B4, C8 & C9) will be running in year levels
- The age for students is the first day of term 2 – **Monday 1st May 2017**. So for example if you have a 9 year old girl who turns 10 on 10th May she will still run in the 9 year old girls
- Only the 1st and 2nd place getters in the age categories (7, 8, 9, 10 & 11 year olds) will represent Glenholme School at the Inter-School Cross Country on 27th June
