

Opening of A4 New Entrant Class

Due to increase new entrant numbers Glenholme School will be opening another class, A4. We are expecting the class to fill up towards the end of the year. Property Project Developments

This will be a series of massive projects and we have every intention to have them completed prior to the start of the 2018 school year. However the school community will be kept informed as to the progress of the development closer to the time.
