Rotorua Central Community of Learning - CoL/ Kahui Ako

The Rotorua Central Community of Learning (CoL/ Kahui Ako) comprises eight schools:

Glenholme School; Malfroy School; Rotorua Seventh Day Adventist School; Ngakuru

School; Whakarewarewa School; Rotorua Intermediate, Rotorua Boys' High School and Rotorua Girls' High School.



A culture of professional sharing and respect exists among these schools already and with the introduction of the Rotorua Central CoL/ Kahui Ako the schools will continue to develop and enhance these relationships whilst undertaking achievement challenges to raise student achievement across all eight schools.

Nancy Macfarlane Principal of Glenholme School is the lead principal for the Rotorua Central CoL/ Kahui Ako.

The Rotorua Central CoL/ Kahui Ako has a number of achievement challenges that we are addressing together to raise students progress and achievement:

- Literacy—Writing and Reading
- ◇ Literacy Learning Progressions
- ◇ PaCT Tool Implementation
- ◇ Moderation within schools and across the CoL/ Kahui Ako
- Students with Additional Learning Needs
- Transitions within schools and across the CoL/ Kahui Ako
- Culturally Responsive Practice
- NCEA Level 2

The Rotorua Central CoL/Kahui Ako has been established since 2015 and has continued to grow from 6-8 schools, we continue to grow our relationships and partnerships and continue to grow our shared understandings towards improved learner pathways for our tamariki. The work developed by the CoL/ Kahui Ako is underpinned by Theory of Improvement Plans towards meeting our Rotorua Central CoL/ Kahui AKo achievement challenges.

New Assessment Tool Used at Glenholme School

Glenholme School has introduced a new assessment tool. The Progress and Consistency Tool—PaCT is an online tool that supports teaching and learning. 2017 all students will be assessed in writing, then introduced in 2018—reading and 2019—mathematics.

What does PaCT do?

- Unpacks the curriculum content of mathematics, reading and writing;
- Prompts teachers to notice how students use mathematics, reading and writing to support learning across the curriculum;
- Illustrates the significant steps that learners take as they progress in mathematics, reading and writing;
- Supports moderation within and across Community of Learning Schools;
- Informs teaching programmes;
- Supports consistent overall judgments of student progress and achievement of the National Standards;
- Creates reports that help teachers and school leaders monitor the progress of students.

The PaCT has:

- Learning progression frameworks that break down mathematics, reading and writing and illustrate the stages of learning.
- An 'engine' that captures teacher judgments on aspects of mathematics reading and writing and recommends an overall National Standards judgment that a teacher confirms or reviews.

PaCT will support consistent overall judgments of student progress and achievement of the National Standards throughout the Community of Learning Schools including Rotorua Intermediate and Rotorua Boys and Girls High Schools.

Because all Community of Learning Schools will be utilising this tool—student information regarding progress and achievement in writing, reading and mathematics can be moved from Glenholme to Rotorua Intermediate to Rotorua Boys and Girls High Schools
