Proposed Enrolment Scheme

Purpose

To avoid over-crowding or the likelihood of overcrowding at Glenholme.

Overcrowding

The need to avoid overcrowding does not take precedence over the right of enrolment which are guaranteed to in zone students. Board must determine a roll figure around which it can manage overcrowding while at the same time providing enrolment of all students who apply for enrolment from within the home zone.

Proposed Home Zone

When drawing up a home zone

- Consultation with Ministry of Education
- Consultation with sector community
- Consultation with parents/ whanau
 1. within the home zone
 2. outside of the home

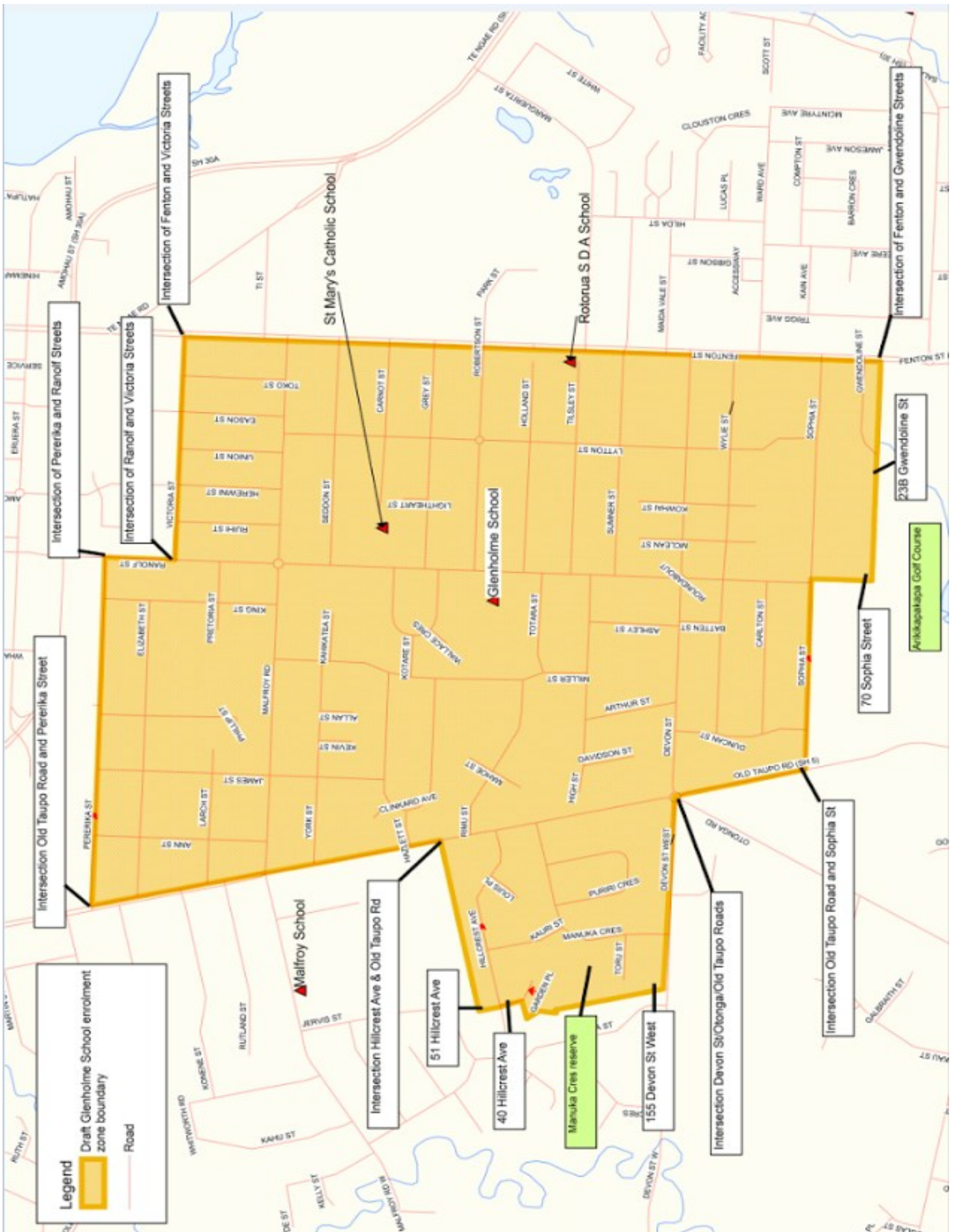
Out of Zone Enrolments

Out of zone students who apply for enrolment at the school must be accepted in the following order of priority

1. sibling of current students
2. siblings of former students
3. child of a former student
4. children of the board employees or a child of a board member
5. all other students

If there are more applicants in priority groups than there are places available, selection within the priority group must be by ballot
