Glenholme School Enrolment Scheme

The board invites applications from parents who wish to enrol their sons and daughters at Glenholme School for next year.

Enrolment at Glenholme School is governed by an enrolment scheme, details of which are available from the school office.

The board has determined that 15 places are likely to be available for Year 1 out of zone students next year and 15 places Year 2-6 out of zone places available for next year. The exact number of places will depend on the number of applications received from students who live within the school's home zone.

Next year there will be 3 enrolment periods.

- 31st Jan to the last day of term 1, 13th April
- 30th April to the last day of term 2, 6th July
- 23rd July to the last day of term 3, 28th Sept

For students seeking enrolment within the first enrolment period, the deadline for receipt of applications (Enrolment Form) for out of zone places is Friday 1st December 2017.

Parents of students who live within the home zone and intend enrolling their child at any time during the next year should notify the school by this date to assist the school to plan appropriately for next year.

If the number of out of zone applications exceeds the number of places available, students will be selected by a ballot. If a ballot of out of zone places is required, it will be held on Monday 4th December. Parents will be informed of the outcome of the ballot within three school days of the ballot being held.

Details relating to the second enrolment period is as follows.

- Length of enrolment period: 30th April to the 6th July
- Deadline for receipt of applications: 16th March 2018
- Date of Ballot: 19th March 2018
