B Block Property

B1 and B2 are settled in their respective classrooms. B4 and B5 are now situated in the hall until mid-June when their classrooms are also expected to be completed. B3 will be the last class to experience the upgrade and move into the hall whilst the work is being completed. Justin and Noel from Burton Construction have been working tirelessly on the project with Sigma Consultants and Mrs Macfarlane. The finished classes are a fine example of modern, innovative learning environments for our tamariki. The Ministry of Education has funded this B Block development however funds are limited and allocated once every 5 years. Therefore the Glenholme School Board of Trustees has fully funded the canopy over the B Block deck and the new exterior doors across B1 - B5. These two additions to the project ensure that the classrooms can be utilised as indoor/ outdoor learning spaces. The project is expected to be completed during the next school holidays with all of B Block, Tihi-o-tonga Team back in their classrooms for Term Three learning.

New Entrant Enrolments

Pukehangi Team of A7, C8 and C9 will be expanding in Term Three. noticeable at pre-school class lt Wednesday afternoons that our numbers are continuing to grow. However growth is expected to slow between now and next term. Glenholme School will be opening a 4th class in Pukehangi Team, Room NE. This classroom, Room NE will be situated across the corridor from A7. Leadership is in process of appointing a teacher for the position and will be monitoring the situation closely. If the numbers grow rapidly during term two then this will be reassessed and addressed in a timely manner. In the interim A7 will have a full time teacher aide appointed to the classroom to support Mrs Palmer and our new entrant tamariki of Glenholme School.


Principal Awards

GLENHOLME SCHOOL ENROLMENT SCHEME

The board invites applications from parents who wish to enrol their sons and daughters at Glenholme School for next term.

The board has determined that there are some places in Year 2, Year 5 and Year 6 available for Term Three for out of zone students. The exact number of places will depend on the number of applications received from students who live within the school's home zone.

Details relating to the second enrolment period is as follows:

- Length of enrolment period: 23rd July to 28th September
- Deadline for receipt of applications: 22nd June
- Date of Ballot: 25th June 2018

Parents of students who live within the home zone and intend enrolling their child at any time during the year should notify the school to assist the school to plan appropriately for the next terms.

If the number of out of zone applications exceeds the number of places available, students will be selected by ballot. If a ballot of out of zone places is required, it will be held on 25th June 2018.

Parents will be informed of the outcome of the ballot within three school days of the ballot being held.

Extra Uniform

We have an increasing amount of students that are needing a change of clothes during the day. If you know your child may require a change, please can parents pack extra shorts/culottes/underwear in their bag as the office is at present running extremely low on these items.
