### **New Entrant Enrolments**

Pukehangi Team of A7, C8 and C9 will be expanding in Term Three. It is noticeable at pre-school Wednesday afternoons that our numbers are continuing to grow. However growth is expected to slow between now and next term. Glenholme School will be opening a 4<sup>th</sup> class in Pukehangi Team, Room NE. This classroom, Room NE will be situated across the corridor from A7. Leadership is in process of appointing a teacher for the position and will be monitoring the situation closely. If the numbers grow rapidly during term two then this will be reassessed and addressed in a timely manner. In the interim A7 will have a full time teacher aide appointed to the classroom to support Mrs Palmer and our new entrant tamariki of Glenholme School.

#### **Ranolf Street Gates**

## **Strep Throat**

Parents please be aware there have been a number of step throat conditions at the school at present. If your child has any of the below symptoms please get them checked as soon as you can. The Rapid Response nurses visit our school every Wednesday at 10.30am.

Strep throat, also called streptococcal sore throat, is an infection of the throat and tonsils caused by Streptococcal bacteria. Typical symptoms are sore throat, chills, fever, and swollen lymph nodes in the neck. Strep throat is cured by antibiotic treatment. If left untreated, strep throat can cause serious heart and kidney complications.

Sore throats can be associated with colds and flu, tonsillitis and strep throat.

#### Causes

The majority of sore throats are caused by viruses, most commonly a cold or flu virus. A viral sore throat will usually get better by itself, and has a low likelihood of complications.

A sore throat caused by bacteria, however, has a higher chance of complication and requires more attention. A sore throat in children that is accompanied by headache, high fever, stomach-ache, vomiting or severe tiredness, with or without a red rash, indicates the need for a visit to a family GP.

Although many types of bacteria can cause throat infections, Streptococcus, or strep, is the most common cause of bacterial sore throat.

Strep throat is contagious. It is spread by close contact with an infected person, often by inhaling airborne droplets from an infected person's coughs and sneezes. It can also be spread through shared food or drinks.

Close-quarter living conditions, such as a family home, and school and university hostels, provide an ideal environment for the transmission of strep throat from one person to another. Children between the ages of 5 and 15 years have the highest incidence of strep throat. A strep throat infection may involve inflammation of the tonsils (bacterial tonsillitis). However, treatment of the condition is likely to be different to that for viral tonsillitis.

#### Signs and symptoms

Symptoms of strep throat develop one to four days after exposure to the bacteria via airborne droplets or by direct contact with an infected person.

The most characteristic symptoms of strep throat are sore throat and painful swallowing. Other symptoms include:

- Chills and fever
- Swollen and tender glands (lymph nodes) on the sides of the neck
- Red and swollen appearance inside the throat
- Pus-like white or yellow patches or spots may be visible on the back of the throat and on the tonsils
- Headache, nausea and vomiting may also be present
- Body aches and pains.

Some people will develop a red skin rash that feels rough to the touch. A strep throat infection accompanied by this distinctive rash is known as scarlet fever. The rash is caused by toxins produced by the Streptococcus pyogenes bacterium

#### Complications

Potential complications of untreated strep throat infection include <u>middle ear infection</u> (<u>otitis media</u>), <u>sinus infection (sinusitis</u>), <u>pneumonia</u>, <u>meningitis</u>, kidney disease, and rheumatic fever. Of these, rheumatic fever and kidney disease are of most concern.

#### **GLENHOLME SCHOOL ENROLMENT SCHEME**

The board invites applications from parents who wish to enrol their sons and daughters at Glenholme School for next term.

The board has determined that there are some places in Year 2, Year 5 and Year 6 available for Term Three for out of zone students. The exact number of places will depend on the number of applications received from students who live within the school's home zone.

Details relating to the second enrolment period is as follows:

- Length of enrolment period: 23rd July to 28th September
- Deadline for receipt of applications: 22nd June
- Date of Ballot: 25th June 2018

Parents of students who live within the home zone and intend enrolling their child at any time during the year should notify the school to assist the school to plan appropriately for the next terms.

If the number of out of zone applications exceeds the number of places available, students will be selected by ballot. If a ballot of out of zone places is required, it will be held on 25th June 2018.

Parents will be informed of the outcome of the ballot within three school days of the ballot being held.

#### **Extra Uniform**

We have an increasing amount of students that are needing a change of clothes during the day. If you know your child may require a change, please can parents pack extra shorts/culottes/underwear in their bag as the office is at present running extremely low on these items.

#### **Change of Address or Contact Phone Numbers**

If you have any change of address or new phone numbers please let the office know as soon as possible. These are required to be kept up to date to any urgent situation or sickness that may develop.

### **Teachers Union Meeting**

Dear Parents,

You may be aware of the nationwide crisis in recruiting and retaining teachers.

While there are many more children coming into the school system, there are not enough new teachers being trained. Urgent and significant changes are needed to ensure that the teaching profession can attract the people it needs and to ensure class sizes do not start to increase.

On *Thursday 28th June* the teachers from this school will be attending a NZEI Te Riu Roa paid union meeting regarding the *Kua Tae Te Wā* - It's Time campaign. The campaign aims to free teachers to teach and principals to lead, by getting the additional support and staff that schools need. The meetings will allow our teachers to discuss how the Ministry of Education has responded to changes that the union is seeking.

Our teaching staff are members of NZEI and legally entitled to attend this meeting. The teachers will be leaving school on *Thursday 28th June* to attend their paid union meeting which starts at 2pm.

I strongly encourage parents to make arrangements to pick their child(ren) up from school by 12.50pm on Thursday 28th June. If you are unable to pick your children up then, please advise us so that your children can be supervised until 3pm, the end of our normal school day.

I appreciate that this creates some inconvenience for families. However, I encourage you to support your teachers as they strive to achieve the changes which will safeguard quality education for all children and ensure we make teaching an attractive profession for graduates.

Anyone who may need help with arrangements should contact the office.

#### **Borrowed Uniform**

Can parents please return all borrowed uniform from the school to the office as soon as possible. It is also helpful to the school if parents name all clothing so these are easily recognised by your children.

#### **School Donations**

- Glenholme School 2018 donation is \$20.00 per term or \$70 for the year if paid in full during Term One. If you have 2 or more children and pay in the first term you will only need to pay \$60 per child for the year.
- School donations are greatly appreciated. Donations from parents and whanau are wisely allocated toward student special programmes. Please consider supporting the school and making provisions for our students that they may miss out on if donations are not made.

#### **Collecting Students**

- Parents are asked to call in at the office if they are collecting children during the day. This is for the safety of our students when they are in our care at school.
- All children need to be collected at 3pm or be in GASP care. There is no supervision of the playgrounds after 3pm.

Please also use the pedestrian crossing when you are crossing the road, this is a good example to the children.


The car park in the school grounds is for Staff parking.
