- ★ This event is hugely supported by the school community and we endeavour to make it accessible to all our parents and whanau. Glenholme School students are free when accompanied by an adult for the evening shows when their whanau are performing.
- ★ Due to Health and Safety standards we have to ensure that we have safe numbers in the hall at all performances.
- ★ The evening performances are always packed so tickets will need to be purchased for all evening shows.
- ★ **There will be an initial limit of 2 tickets per student. Tickets will be \$2.50 each.**
- ★ Any unsold tickets will then be reallocated and on-sold to the general public. We will notify the community of these tickets on our facebook page and school app.
- ★ All tickets will be sold prior to the evening shows. NO tickets will be sold on the night and there will be NO door sales.
- ★ The evening shows will sell out so make sure you get your tickets when they become available.
- ★ Matinee performances at 11.20am will remain as a gold coin donation.

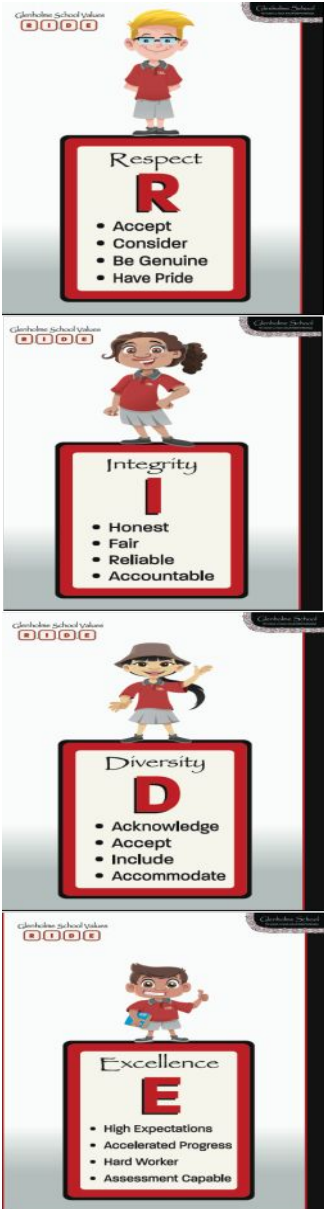
Change of Hours During the Production

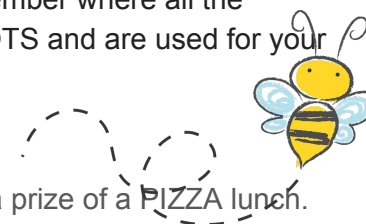
Glenholme School F.O.T.S. Spelling Bee 2018
