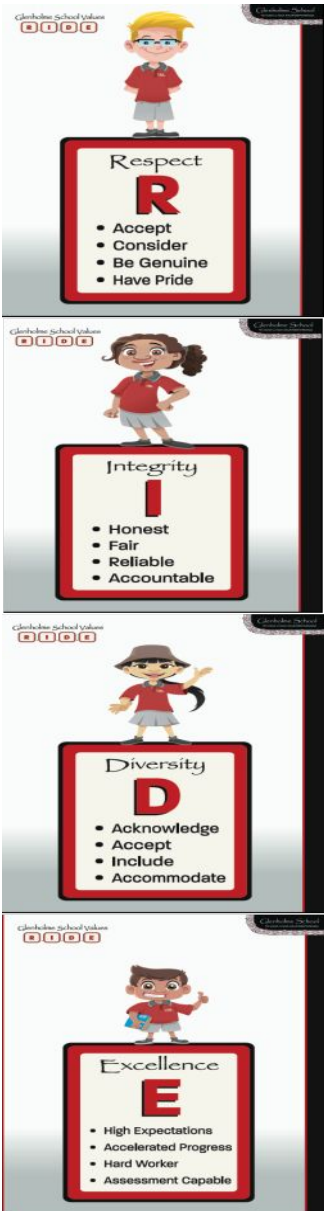

Notices To Parents

SunSmart for 2017

It's October already, the spring blossoms are out and before you know it, it will be summer!

From October through to end of April, between 10am to 4pm when the sun's ultraviolet (UV) rays are most intense, Glenholme School will be working very hard to ensure that children under their care are protected from dangerous UV rays. You can support Glenholme School by:

- Providing your child/children with a School hat that will offer protection to the neck, ears and face to slap on at school when outside between 10am and 4pm. They have been scientifically proven to provide adequate sun protection.
- You can wear a SunSmart hat yourself as children like to copy you.
- Your child will be encouraged to slop on SPF30+ broad spectrum sunscreen on any skin not covered by clothes. Should you wish, you may opt to supply a labelled bottle with your child/children's name which can be kept at the school.

Remember nearly 80% of lifetime sun exposure happens before the age of 18, so it's important to make sun protection a life-long habit, starting as young as possible.

Term Four - Compulsory Sun Hats

Students must wear a sun hat in Term Four when they are outside. Restricted play will be enforced for students without a sunhat. Reminder that all parents and whanau signed an agreement on enrolment regarding the Glenholme School Uniform Policy. This policy clearly states that the official School Sun Hat must be worn as the brim provides cover for the neck, ears, nose and face. The School Sun Hat can be purchased at NZ Uniforms retail shop or online.

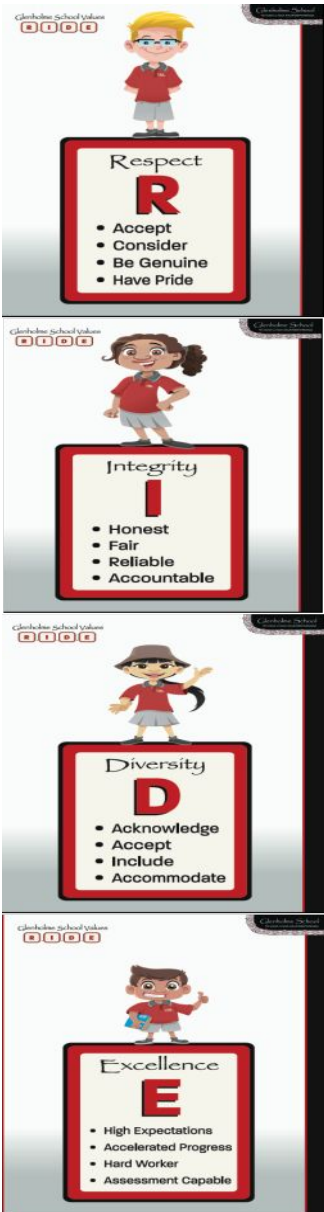

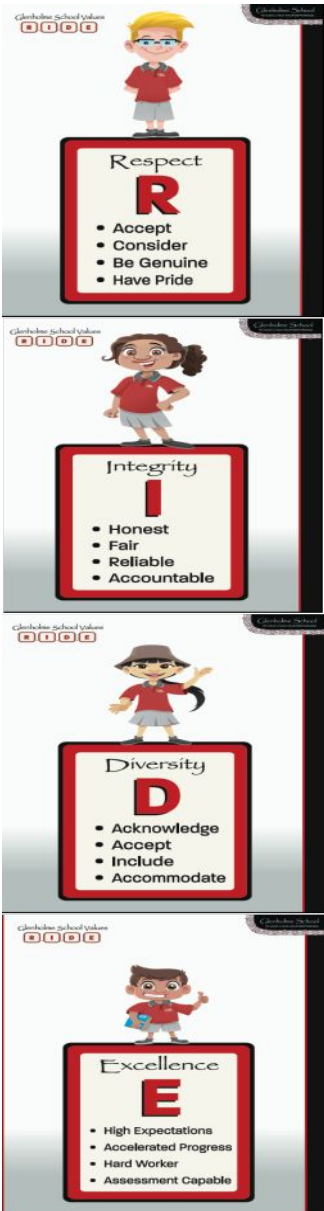

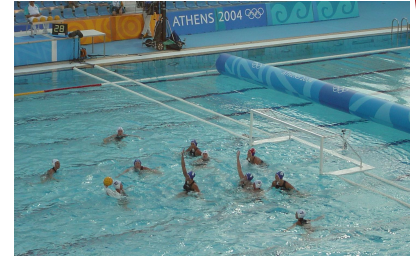

Life Education

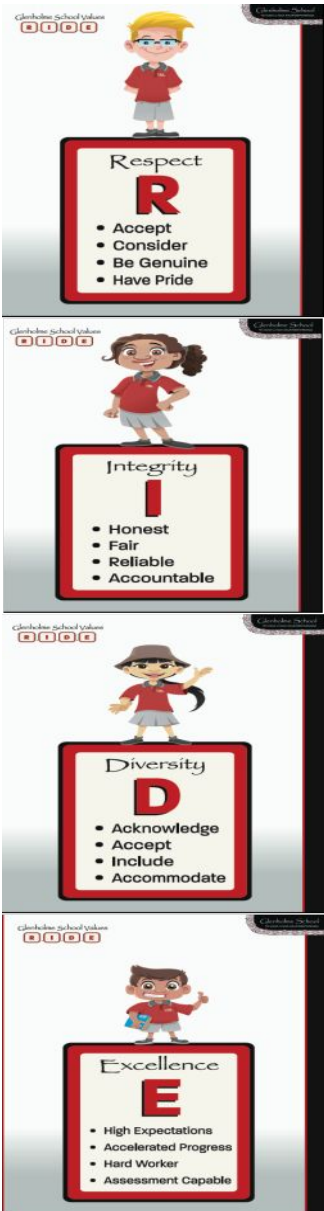

Entry Age: Entry is open to all 7 to 15 olds (based on age on event day)

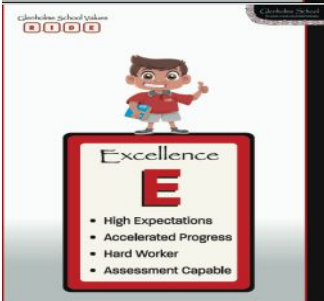
Event Distances: Individual - 7 years; Swim 50m; Cycle 4km; Run 1.5km

The Rotorua Weet-Bix Kids TRYathlon is located at Kuirau Park. The TRYathlon will begin with the swim leg in the heated outdoor pool at the Rotorua Aquatic Centre where the pool is 50m in length. The transition area is located on the field beside the Aquatic Centre. The bike leg is around the streets surrounding Kuirau Park, and the leg run is around Kuirau Park itself.
