Whakapoungakau and Tihi-o-Tonga Athletics Day


Our tamariki are well into their training for our Year 3-6 Athletics Day. This exciting sports event will be on Monday 5th November starting at 9.30am. The postponement date for this event is Friday 9th November. The students will rotate around 5 track and field disciplines; long jump, high jump, shot put, discus and sprints (60m, 100m and 200m). Students 9 years and older (as of 15th Oct) that place in the finals, will go through to the Rural/Central Athletics Competition in mid November at the International Stadium. If tamariki are successful at this event, they will compete in the EBOP/CBOP Championships on the 4th December over in Whakatane. We encourage all parents, caregivers and whanau to come and watch and support our tamariki on the day. We do require parent helpers for both Monday and Friday (the postponement day). Entry Age: Entry is open to all 7 to 15 olds (based on age on event day)

Event Distances: Individual - 7 years; Swim 50m; Cycle 4km; Run 1.5km

8-10 years; Swim 100m; Cycle 4km; Run 1.5km

11-15 years; Swim 200m; Cycle 8km; Run 1.5km

Teams - Junior Teams; Swim 100m; Cycle 4km; Run 1.5km

Senior Teams; Swim 200m; Cycle 8km; Run 1.5km (NB: One team member

completes the swim, one team member completes the cycle and both complete the run).

The TRYathlon will begin with the swim leg in the heated outdoor pool at the Rotorua Aquatic Centre where the pool is 50m in length. The transition area is located on the field beside the Aquatic Centre. The bike leg is around the streets surrounding Kuirau Park, and the leg run is around Kuirau Park itself. 


