The TRYathlon will begin with the swim leg in the heated outdoor pool at the Rotorua Aquatic Centre where the pool is 50m in length. The transition area is located on the field beside the Aquatic Centre. The bike leg is around the streets surrounding Kuirau Park, and the leg run is around Kuirau Park itself. You can download the course map from the Event Day info tab to see the full routes.
