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Walking School Bus - our 2 Walking School Bus co-ordinators started this week


We have 2 routes – see map attached. The plan is to stick to just these two routes once a week for at least the first half of next term to give us a chance to iron out any wrinkles.

There is an assigned co-ordinator for each route. Georgie will liaise with these co-ordinators during next term.

Georgie has emailed the co-coordinators of the Green and Red routes. They have a list of children signed up to walk with them and the days they want to walk. For now Monday for the Green route and Wednesdays for the Red route.

NZEI Principals negotiations

Primary principals across the country have voted to reject the government's offer for settlement of our negotiations. The government failed to make an offer that addresses our key issues. We are concerned that little is being done to ensure that being a primary principal is seen as an attractive career option.

While I'm really happy that our teachers won back parity with their secondary colleagues, the same wasn't offered to primary principals. We think that if parity with secondary is fair for teachers, then surely it's fair for principals.

The offer also would have seen some principals in smaller schools paid less than some teachers in larger schools. It's important that all communities are able to attract teachers into becoming principals, and that won't happen if they can earn more as a teacher.

As a sign of our concern we have voted to withdraw the goodwill we extend to the Ministry of Education work that is additional to our day to day role running schools. I will not be participating in any form of work programme, taskforce, meeting with or reporting to the Ministry between July 8 and August 16. I will continue my professional leadership of the school during this time.

Principals continue to hope that the government will hear us and address our issues. We are committed to continuing our campaign until they do. Personally I am grateful for the support that our parent community has shown throughout the campaign. I hope our parent community and teachers will continue to show your support next term if it is necessary.

Changes to the Pita Pit School Lunch Menu.

Starting from the beginning of Term 3 Pita Pit is providing more options for your children to choose when ordering their lunch from Pita Pit.

Roast Lamb and Grilled Steak have been added to the list of Main Meats and Proteins. Green Salad Mix, Red Slaw, Mushrooms, Corn, Green Capsicum and Quinoa Brown Rice have been added to the extensive list of Fillings. Smashed Avocado has been added in the Extra Fillings, with an additional charge of \$1.50. It is real Avocado that we smash daily.

We also want to help you to encourage your children to have more salads so we have reduced the price on the Extra Fillings from \$0.50 to \$0.30 per filling. We hope your children will try more fillings in their Pitas.

We have added more sauces to the Menu, and some of them are pretty amazing. Sweet Chilli, Hummus, Lemon Dijon, Turmeric Ginger Yoghurt, Sriracha Mayo, Smoked Chipotle Mayo, Cucumber Yoghurt and Hot Chilli. We have also added the option for Extra Sauces. If your child wants to try some of these new ones together with their old favourite we can add extra sauces for a small additional charge of \$0.30 per sauce.

Our salads now come in environmentally salad bowls rather than boxes. We are working on finding an environmentally friendly fork that can be used. These have been very popular in our store and the children who have ordered Salad Bowls tend to re order them.
