

## **‘Learning, succeeding, and thriving in education’ survey**

Our school has decided to participate in a strength-based project about how students learn, succeed and thrive at school. This project is being conducted by Dr Melinda Webber from the University of Auckland and has been funded by the Royal Society of New Zealand, Te Apārangi. Our school would like to invite you to take part in this important research project by completing a short questionnaire - either online or in hard copy.

Completing this survey will help our school to find out more about how our students develop positive attitudes, engagement and aspirations towards school, and who their role-models for success are. Overall the questionnaires will help us to better understand the personal, teacher, whānau and community factors that positively impact our students learning and success at school.

This study involves you:

- Completing a questionnaire about your child’s attitude, engagement at school and their future aspirations. It also asks you to nominate and describe a family member, tribal or local role-model for your child.
- Letting your child’s teacher know if you do not want your child to complete the questionnaire.

Each questionnaire should take between 15-30 minutes to complete. Your child will be given this as a homework task this week. If you agree to participate please complete either the hard copy questionnaire and return it to the school office. ### **Whakapoungakau and Tihiōtonga Athletics Day**

The Whakapoungakau and Tihiōtonga teams will be holding their School Athletics Day on **Wednesday 6th November** (pp Friday 8th November). All Year 3-6 tamariki will compete in the following track and field events; 60m, 100m and 200m sprint, long jump, high jump, shot put and discus. The day will start at 9.20am and finish just before 3pm. All children are to arrive at school in school uniform and can then change into appropriate clothing (shorts & t/shirts). At the end of the day the expectation is that they will leave school in their school uniform. All tamariki will need their school hat, a water bottle, any medical requirements, morning tea and lunch and we encourage applying sunblock in the morning at home. There will be sunblock at school to re-apply throughout the day. The events will get underway at approximately 9.20am and will finish in the afternoon with the final sprint races and class relays (if time permits) towards the end of the day. 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### **Te Ahurei - Rotorua Primary Schools Kapa Haka Festival**

The annual Ahurei Rotorua Primary Schools Kapa Haka Festival will be held at the Rotorua Energy Events Centre this year. The week-long festival starts on Monday 25<sup>th</sup> November going through to Friday 29<sup>th</sup> November. Our Kapa Haka group perform on **Wednesday 27th November in the first half** (first half show starts at 5.30pm). There are 4 schools performing in the first half and we are on second. Our Kapa Haka performance is looking fantastic and the tamariki are excited and are looking forward to showcasing their talents.

Parents and whanau with tamariki in the Kapa Haka roopu can now prepay tickets to ensure you do not miss out on a seat. The tickets are **\$9 for a half show**. If you are planning on watching the entire show you will need to purchase your full show ticket down at the Rotorua Energy Events Centre when they become available to the general public. We have been allocated a set amount of tickets. Each Kapa Haka child is able to purchase **3 tickets**. Everyone must have a ticket to get into the auditorium (including toddlers). Babies under the age of one however are allowed to sit on the lap of an adult. The Energy Events Centre reserves the right to refuse entry to those who do not have a ticket for their toddler. This is to ensure the Energy Events Centre fire safety requirements are met. If more tickets become available, we will let you know. Tickets and a programme of the evening will be sent out via the students at a later date.

Our Kapa Haka roopu has been working very hard and we look forward to performing to you our whanau and the community on Wednesday night at the Energy Events Centre. We will be having a full dress rehearsal in the school hall prior to our performance night. The date and time still needs to be finalised so we will let you know when this has been confirmed.
