School Uniform and Dress Code

Compulsory School Uniform for all Year 0-6 students, The dress code has been designed to give students a wide choice of options whilst maintaining a school identity.

- · Compulsory School Uniform Sun Hat for Yr 0-6 students in terms 1 and 4
- \cdot Shoes or sandals are to be plain black
- \cdot Socks are to be plain black
- \cdot Girls winter tights to be black
- Polypropylene or thermals (winter months) worn under the school uniform must be black Notes:
- · Students must wear regulation school uniform, non uniform items similar in colour and style are not acceptable.
- When a student comes to school with incorrect uniform and without a notice of explanation, parents are contacted and asked to collect their child, and take them home to dress them correctly and then return them to school. However the school does have items that students can borrow and will be instructed to wear for the day.
- \cdot Any non uniform clothing items will be confiscated and must be collected by the student at the end of each day or by parents.
- \cdot The school accepts no responsibility for any non uniform clothing items.
- · All school uniform items should be clearly named.
- \cdot The only jewellery items to be worn are medic alert ID, small stud earrings, a wrist watch or items of religious or cultural significance.

Glenholme After School Care Programme (GASP)

This is a private business and available to local district students including Glenholme School students. GASP runs each afternoon from 3.00-5.30pm, on school days only and in the holidays. A school holiday programme is also run during all school holidays. Lost Property

We have an ongoing problem with our lost property. We regularly have large piles of unnamed and unrecognised clothing. Currently lost property is kept alongside the caretakers shed in the front of the school. Lost clothing is on show for the children to look at, and if not claimed within 4 weeks is collected, washed and is likely to be on sold in the second hand uniform sales. Any named property is given back to the owner. Students are responsible for their clothing, please check that children bring items home each day. Please ensure that the school uniform is clearly named.

Bikes, Scooters, Roller Blades and Skateboards

These items are not appropriate for use in the school grounds. Biking to and from school is not affected, however these devices in and around school, before or after school is not allowed. For astro-turf care and protection such devices are not to be used at anytime. Students that have attended GASP or played at school will no longer be able to do so. Thank you for your support and understanding.

Dental Therapist and Service

The Rotorua District Health Board has a Mobile Clinic Service that visits Glenholme School. The Mobile Clinic when on site is situated beside the Library.

When the Mobile Clinic is not here at school, for any dental emergencies parents will need to contact Rotorua District Health regarding the nearest operating Dental Service in Rotorua to get treatment. Do not contact the school, unfortunately we will not be able to help direct you to treatment as it is the Ministry of Health and Rotorua District Health Board that manage the dental service and not the school or Ministry of Education.

Principals Awards

Even weeks of school term Principal Award recipients are announced via the School Newsletter. Odd weeks of the school term, Principal Award recipients are acknowledged at the Friday School Assembly starting in Week 4 (parents welcome).

Students receive a printed certificate (with the details of their success and achievement), as recognition in-front of the whole school. Those recognised for the Principal Award will sit in the first row of the seats in assembly. After assembly recipients retire to the staffroom with Mrs Thompson for a special morning-tea. Parents and whanau are welcome to attend School Assemblies at 9.15am on Fridays to see your child receive their acknowledgement.

Pita Pit School Lunch Programme

Glenholme School students can enjoy a healthy, nutritious and delicious meal at school. Pita Pit Rotorua has partnered up with and Lunchonline to provide a service that will deliver great food on time to our tamariki. Parents and Caregivers will find the ordering platform easy to use, and can make an order right up until 9am of the day they want lunch for their child/ren.

How does it work?

Lunchonline is a service which allows parents to order and pay for school lunches on line. Parents can place order prior to 9am. The orders are then printed onto labels at Pita Pit. The labels contain the child's name, classroom and their entire order. The Pitas are then made fresh, labelled, organised into classrooms and delivered by Pita pit to the school at 12.30pm on a Tuesday and a Thursday each week.

How does Lunchonline (LOL) work?

- · Parents register and open an account on www.lunchonline.co.nz
- · Each account can have one or more children.
- \cdot When a student is set up on the account, they are attached to a school.
- \cdot An order is placed for a student selecting Pita Pit in the Food provider's menu.
- \cdot There is a minimum amount of \$10.00 initial credit required, which can be credited to the account via credit card or internet banking.
- \cdot When the credit is used, the account can be topped up as required.
- \cdot At anytime the account can be closed and the credit balance refunded (less a small administration fee which is waived at the end of the school year).
- · Orders can be placed many days in advance.
- · Pita Pit has a 9am cut-off time for orders.
- \cdot Orders can be cancelled up until the cut-off time so if an order has been made in advance and the child is sick on that day, it is a very easy matter to cancel the order.
- \cdot The account will be credited with the value of the cancelled order.

Coronavirus - what you need to know

While we are still learning more about this new virus - we do know the risk of the virus spreading in New Zealand is very low

How worried should I be?

- Your chances of catching the coronavirus in New Zealand are very low. ٠
- It is highly unlikely you will catch the virus ٠
 - walking down the street,
 - in a supermarket or
 - on public transport.
- Coronavirus is slightly more infectious than the flu you are only likely to ٠ catch it if you are close to someone with the virus. Most people catch the virus from someone at home, a close workmate or someone they spend time with.
- People will not be moving around the community if they are suspected of ٠ having the virus - they will be in isolation. Their family and anyone they may have infected will also be asked to stay at home.

How serious is coronavirus?

- People are being infected, mainly in China, but only a very small number • have died.
- Most people have a mild illness. ٠
- People of all ages are being infected, but older people and those with ٠ medical conditions seem most likely to get seri

How do I protect myself and my family?

Everyone should protect themselves from the virus, as you would for the flu -

- Washing your hands regularly, or using hand sanitiser, is the best way to avoid this illness.
- As with other illnesses, do not go to work or school if you are sick. ٠
- · Cover coughs and sneezes with tissues or clothing, and wash hands afterwards
- Avoid being close to people who are sick

Our school has been working with SchoolDocs to create a website for our policies and procedures. We are excited to announce that the site is live and available to our school community.

The school works on a subscription basis with SchoolDocs to maintain, update, and review our policies. SchoolDocs provides us with a comprehensive core set of policies, which have been well researched and follow the Ministry of Education National Administration Guidelines. The policies and procedures are tailored to our school, and the school supplies specific information such as our charter, and procedures for behaviour management, reporting to parents, etc.

SchoolDocs updates, modifies, or creates policies in response to changes in legislation or Ministry guidelines, significant events, reviews/requests from schools, and regular reviewing from the SchoolDocs team. Our board of trustees has the opportunity to view changes/additions and comment on them before they are implemented. We will advise you when policies are up for review and how you can take part in the review.

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School Donations

Glenholme School has opted in to the Government's donations scheme. This means we will not ask parents for any donations (gifts/koha), except for overnight camps. The BOT has very kindly covered the cost of overnight camps in the past to ensure that every child is able to take part.

Anyone can **choose** to make a donation to the school at any time. Donation tax credits can be claimed and GST is not payable.

Student activity payments

Parents cannot be asked to pay for goods and services that are part of the core learning programme (curriculum).

Parents can be asked to pay of goods and services that are additional to the curriculum. Such as playing in a sports team.

Activity payments are required to cover the costs of optional equipment, experiences, and services that are additional to the school's curriculum-based activities that involve a take-home component for the student to keep.

Parents are informed in advance of any additional optional payments that are extra to the school's curriculum obligations.



Sports News


