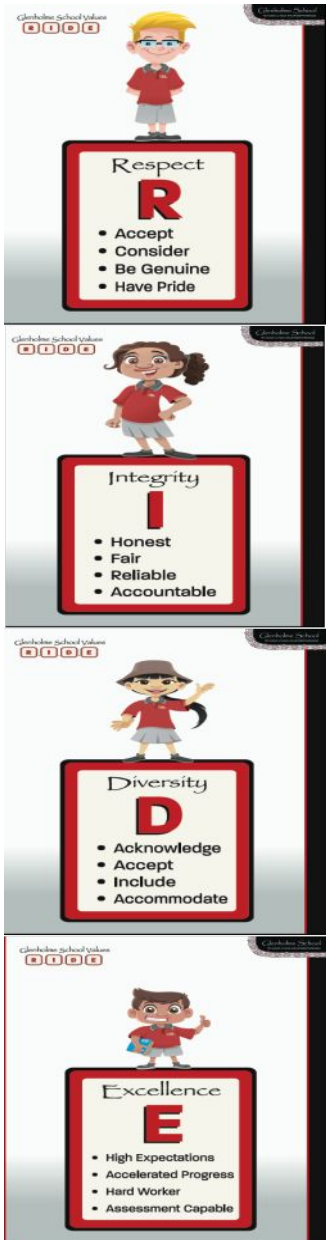

Intervention Programmes at Glenholme School

Glenholme School provides a number of Intervention Programmes across the school catering to a selected group of students requiring extra support in Numeracy and Literacy.

We have five programmes this year all of which are funded by the Ngati Whakaue Education Endowment Trust Board and The Rotorua Energy Charitable Trust. We are extremely grateful for the financial contribution they make towards these programmes.

The Ngati Whakaue Education Endowment Trust Board have been supporting our Intervention Programmes for a number of years which has enabled the programmes to run year after year. The five Intervention Programmes running this year are; The Pikopiko Programme, The Year Old Literacy Programme, The Year 3 and 4 Maths Programme, The Toe by Toe Programme and the PPP (Pause, Prompt, Praise) Programme. An explanation about each of these programmes is on the next page.



Intervention Programmes at Glenholme School

The Pikopiko Programme is a home-school learning based partnership that accelerates the learning progress and achievement of 5 year old tamariki from the time they start school. Deb Taylor an experienced teacher coordinates this programme. Parents and whanau work with the Deb to develop the knowledge necessary for them to support the development of core skills in their children. They are provided with tools, tips and strategies to support their children with their learning.

The 5 Year Old Literacy Intervention Programme targets 5 year old children. Through testing in the first weeks of school we are able to identify children who require extra assistance with either oral language and early reading skills. For the past two terms we have had children on the Booster Group Reading Programme. Mrs Cooney an experienced teacher aide has been delivering this programme for a number of years at Glenholme School.

The Year 3 and 4 Maths Programme is a Numeracy Peer-Tutoring Programme which aims to consolidate and accelerate number knowledge. The aim of the programme is to target students identified in the middle school who have yet to acquire the basic number knowledge skills. This is the third year the programme has been running in the school. It is delivered by June Paretoa an experienced teacher aide..

The PPP (Pause, Prompt, Praise) Reading Programme has been operating at Glenholme School for 19 years. This programme gives additional support to children in Year 5 and 6 who are reading at a level which is below the expected level for their age. We are very fortunate to have volunteer tutors from the community work with our tamariki.

The Toe by Toe Programme supports students that have difficulty decoding text and are reading well below their expected level for their age due to gaps in their knowledge and acquisition of phonics. We have a small group of Year 5 and 6 tamariki who work daily on the Toe by Toe Reading Programme with June Paretoa.
