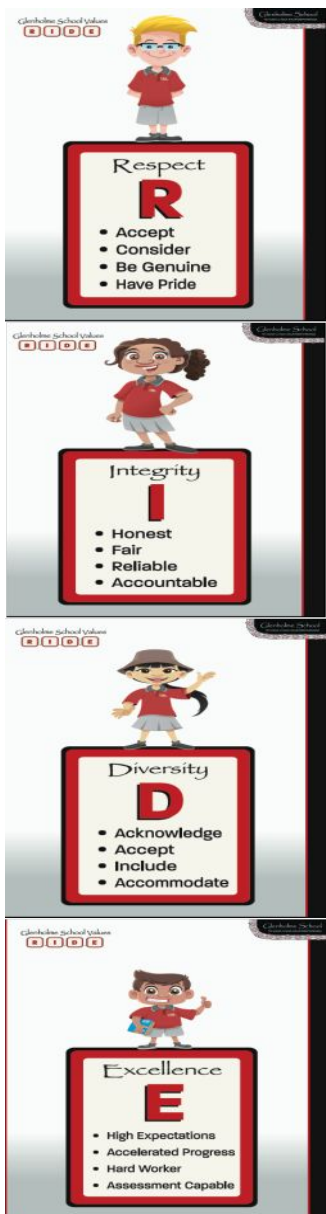

The Water Safety Programme is a joint initiative of Swim Rotorua Swimming Club and Rotorua Swim Magic Swim School. This programme would not be able to run without the funding from Water safety New Zealand, Bay Trust and the Rotorua Energy Charitable Trust.

Our senior students will have the opportunity to learn basic swim skills along with important life skills such as floating on their backs, treading water and signalling for help.

The students will be transported to and from the Rotorua Aquatic Centre by bus every day for the week for their sessions. All costs are covered by the Rotorua Aquatic Centre.
