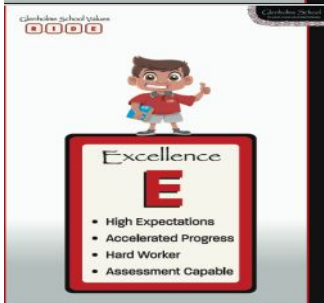
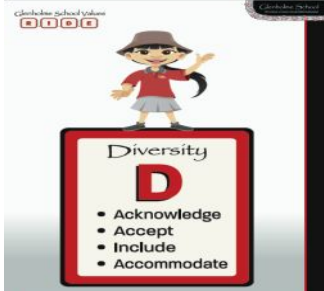
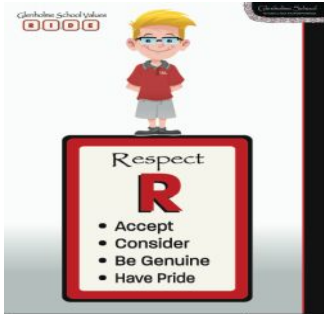

If your child has head lice please do not send them back to school until they have been treated.

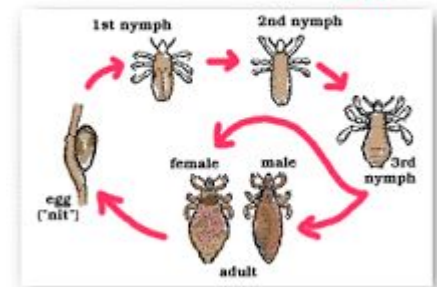
Untreated children may be referred to the Public Health Nurse to avoid continual re-infestation of class members.

Please report any new cases to the school office, as we will endeavour to notify parents.

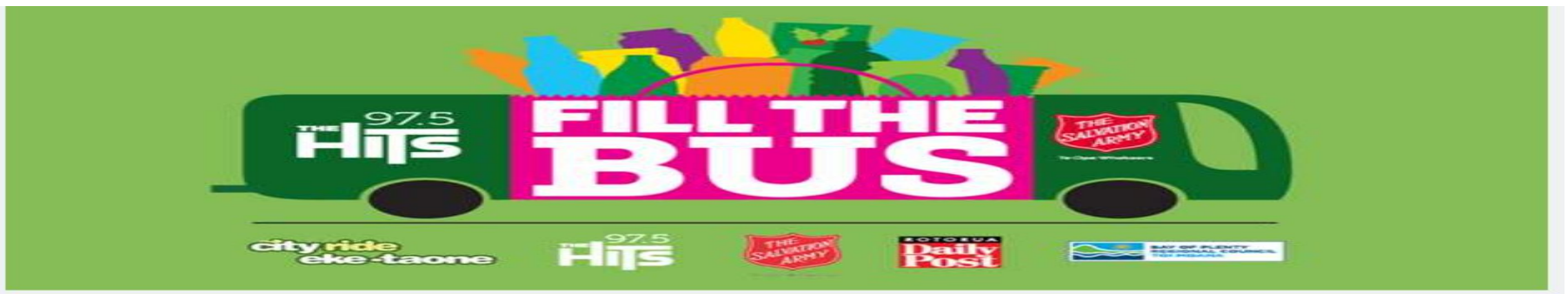
Very effective treatments are readily available from chemists however a combing method is attached as an alternative to the often costly products available.

Please be vigilant and remember we need parents to be pro-active for at least two weeks to break the head lice life cycle.

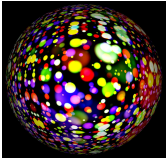
**Which Came First...
the Itchin' or the Egg?**



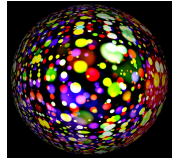
(The Life-Cycle of the Head Louse)

Lunchtime Disco - Friday the 27th of November 2020



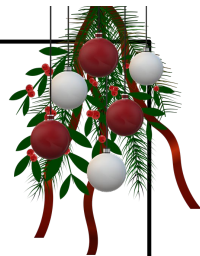
