Touch

The Touch Rugby season is nearly upon us with the after school competition starting on *Tuesday 23rd February* (for the Year 5-8 competition) and Wednesday 24th February (for the Year 1-4 competition). Prior to the season, a grading tournament will be held on Saturday 20th February. The expectation is that all tamariki registered will be available to play on this day. Touch is an after school competition so please be aware that it is the parents/ caregivers/whanau responsibility to get their child to and from the games. The competition will run every Tuesday and Wednesday through to the end of the term at the Westbrook Rugby Fields. For the school to compete in this competition, we require at least one coach per team. A teacher will manage the teams, but we need a parent/whanau member to coach (Rotorua Touch Assoc. will supply referees). No Coaches. No Teams! The subsidised fee for the season is \$20 per child which includes the use of the school uniform, which must be returned at the conclusion of the competition. The Sports Uniform Agreement form needs to be read, signed and returned by both the parent and child. Payment can be made at the school office or via the internet to the following school bank account; 03-1552-0169773-00 (please include your child's full name, room number and 'touch' in the reference details). All forms need to be returned to the teacher in charge tomorrow, Thursday 11th February in order for teams to be registered in time. Payment is also due by Thursday 11th February, thank you.
