Flying High Project - Inspiring Youth to be Sustainable through Innovation

The Whakapoungakau students have the opportunity this year to be a part of the Flying High Project. The Flying High Project was founded by Andrew Parker from Hamilton. In 2014 Andrew drove his truck around the world, taking a hot air balloon to schools and public spaces. He encourages kids to follow their dreams, emphasising the importance of education in order to achieve them. He went to 87 countries over 5 years. He worked with various Children's organisations, the main one being UNICEF.

The Flying High Project aims to;

-Increase the uptake of STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, The Arts and Mathematics) careers through thought provoking presentations and follow-up activities, (fitting in with the school curriculum).

-Inspire kids to be environmentally sustainable through innovation.

-Show career pathways.

-Develop critical thinking and problem solving skills.

The senior students will be participating in a series of lessons throughout terms 1 and 2 delivered in the classroom by the teacher. The project also includes Andrew visiting our school at the end of March with his hot air balloon. Andrew and the Flying High Project team will inflate the balloon on our school field and if the weather is suitable, there may be an opportunity for some of our Year 5 and 6 tamariki to fly 10-15m into the air while the balloon is tied to the ground! This would happen just before school starts, as this is the best time of day for ballooning. As you can imagine we are very excited about this learning opportunity for our tamariki and for the entire school to see a hot air balloon inflated and hopefully flying (tethered), here on the school field.
