They have learnt not only how glass transforms under different heat conditions, but have also had the chance to create 4 different and rather spectacular pieces of artwork, using these different techniques. With the expert help of Jayne, students have created pieces of artwork that reflect their own unique stories about the things they connect with. They have told their stories through their glass art.

As part of the learning journey students have also worked collaboratively to create 3 very special classroom display pieces. Each class piece tells its own story about the learning community within it.


RANOLF STREET DRIVEWAY GATES ARE LOCKED FROM:
